Higher Ground: Best Practices for Floodplain Management

Under the Biggert-Waters National Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012 flood insurance rates are likely to increase overall to reflect the true flood risk of your home and many insurance discounts will be eliminated. This workshop will provide the tools needed to navigate the ordinance update process successfully and create a floodplain management ordinance that makes their communities as safe as possible from floods. Attendees will get an in-depth understanding of not only the minimum federal and state regulatory requirements for floodplain management, but also of higher regulatory floodplain management standards as well as the PA Suggested Ordinance Provisions and recent changes to the requirements for the Community Rating System. This workshop will explore the pros and cons of higher standards and the need to evaluate their floodplain ordinance – as a working tool – periodically to insure that not only are their communities compliant but also disaster resilient. In addition, participants will use a new computer simulator for flood plain management to test best practices for flood plain development.
