

2014 Neighborhood Survey

Targeted approximately 824 households in APN

608 or 74% in Allentown Promise Neighborhood (APN)

2015 Neighborhood Survey


Targeted approximately 824 households in APN, 298 in APZ Southern Region, and 800 in EPN

- 441 or 53.3% in Allentown Promise Neighborhood (APN)
- 337 or 22.6% in Allentown Promise Zone South (APZ)
- 737 or 92% in Easton Promise Neighborhood (EPN)







What is your highest level of education?

Admission Mentoring Program (CAMP).


CAMP pairs a William Allen High school student with a college student mentor and they meet twice a month at the high school to mentor them through the college and scholarship process.








Is your child enrolled in an early childcare or preschool program?
