What is Environmental Justice?

Environmental Justice (EJ) is the **fair treatment** and **meaningful involvement** of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

History of EJ

- Civil Rights and Environmental Movements of the 1960s, 1970s and 1980s
- First National People of Color Environmental Leadership Summit held in 1991
- Executive Order 12898 issued in 1994

History of EJ in PA

- Chester Title VI Action Filed in 1996
- DEP Environmental Justice Work Group (EJWG) created in 1999
- EJWG Report and Recommendations released in 2001
- Office of Environmental Advocate (OEA) established in 2002 and the Environmental Justice Advisory Board (EJAB) in 2004
- Office of Environmental Advocate (OEA) was renamed the Office of Environmental Justice (OEJ) in 2015.




